The 2009 [T.S. Eliot Poetry Prize](#) has been won by Philip Gross for his collection THE WATER TABLE inspired by the Bristol Channel, "drawing out connections with mystery, depth, and the man-made world".

The [Costa Book of the Year 2009](#) has been won by poet Christopher Reid for THE SCATTERING an intensely personal and moving collection written as a tribute to his late wife.

Val McDermid, "queen of the psychological thriller", has won the [Cartier Diamond Dagger](#) award, which honours outstanding achievement in the field of crime writing.

[The Lost Man Booker Prize](#) is a one-off prize to honour books published in 1970. In 1971 the date on which the award was given moved from April to November and, as a result of these changes, there was whole year's gap when a wealth of fiction published in 1970 missed out on the opportunity to win the prize.

The shortlist will be announced in March but the international reading public will decide the winner. The overall winner will be announced in May.
